









OUR GOALS

- The goal of our activities is to ensure that as many children with intellectual disability as possible are brought up within their own families and live an independent life as an adult.
- To assure this, the Foundation provides a range of support services to parents, children, adults and elderly ID persons.
- To demonstrate viability, efficiency and sustainability of community based services (an alternative to institualization) we have built up and maintained a 'cradle to grave' model system based on normalization and integration and the holistic principle.


